

# 2018 Uinta County Fair Items to Note

- All 2018 entries are due online by July 20th at 11:59 PM.  
Any live animal needing to be entered after this deadline will be charged \$50 per entry up to the close of set weigh-in time for that market animal species, the start time of the breeding livestock, or horse show being entered in. After notifying show superintendent, classes entered incorrectly may be switched within the same division prior to start of livestock show, horse show, or static exhibit judging. Any static exhibit entered late will be charged \$10 per entry up to the time the exhibit is due for judging. No classes will be held for late entries.
- A **SEPARATE** Health Inspection form is required for **EACH** exhibitor. These forms may be acquired from 4H Club Leaders and FFA Advisors. Please have these forms filled out before you have the actual inspection completed by a veterinarian. They will verify the information, sign it, and retain the white copy.
- HEALTH INSPECTIONS must be completed by July 20th at 5:00 PM. These forms will be printed in duplicate; white copy will be retained by Vet Clinics, yellow copy is for exhibitor's record. Fair Staff will collect health inspections directly from all three Uinta County Vet Clinics on July 20th at 5:00 PM. If animals are inspected at another location, said Vet Clinic must fax (307-789-6312) Health Inspections directly to the Fair Office by July 20th at 5:00 PM. This ruling is required of EVERY animal to be brought on grounds.
- Shot records for both cats and dogs must be attached to health inspection.
- All market animals must be completely healed from banding or castration before the date of health inspection.
- The fairgrounds will be locked down from 8:00 AM, July 22nd through 12:00 NOON, July 25th for final set-up and preparation for Fair.
- Livestock will be allowed on grounds as of July 25th at NOON, at the owner's risk as the grounds will not be patrolled until July 30th.
- All horses must be out of the horse barn and stalls cleaned out by 2:00 PM July 31st. Stalls on the outside of the barn and behind the small arena may be used during fair on a first come first serve basis.
- Cow/calf pairs are expected on grounds between 4:00-6:00 PM, July 31st and must remain on grounds until release time of all exhibits August 4th. They will be penned in the horse barn again this year.
- A typed or written recipe is required for ALL culinary entries including both 4H and Open Class.
- There will be a Honey class added to Open Class Exhibit Hall.

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- NO animals will be allowed on grounds during the 10 days of Fair except those entered in Fair by the deadline. No overnighting or additional animals will be allowed due to limited space and safety of fairgoers. NO EXCEPTIONS
- No one may approach superintendents, volunteers, or staff with fair complaints of any sort. These concerns must be taken directly to a Fair Board member with the required \$100 protest fee in hand. If this process isn't followed correctly, the offending party will be dismissed from the fairgrounds.
- The exhibitor ages in Open Horse Walk Trot will be 5-8 year olds and 9 years and over. Open Horse Lead Line will be 3-7 year olds. All ages are as of January 1, 2018. These changes have been made for the safety of the exhibitors.
- All livestock information must be submitted online by entry deadline including the correct Wyoming State Fair tag number, Scrapie tag number, and animal description - or the entry will be considered incomplete and void.
- Muzzle use is allowed for lambs and goats. Signs have been created explaining why it is safe for these to be used, and these will be available for any exhibitor to post directly above their animals that will be muzzled, for transparency and understanding of animal husbandry to the public.
- Breeding livestock may only show once individually, and once in a flock. Open class and youth breeding classes will be shown simultaneously in the show ring, thus an animal may only be entered or shown once in open or once in a youth class.
- The number of animals entered by any one exhibitor has been limited to two (2) in any one class.
- No animal will be shown by more than one exhibitor under any circumstance.
- Sawdust is required to be used in all trays for rabbit and poultry cages.
- All cages, stalls, and pens MUST be cleaned out 100% before the exhibitor may leave the grounds August 4th. This includes all decorations being removed.
- Weigh-ins will be as follows on Tuesday, July 31st: Livestock Barn scale (Swine 7:30-9:30, Lambs 9:30-11:00); Beef Barn scale (Goats 7:30-8:30, Beef 8:30-10:00)  
Rabbit/Poultry Barn scale (Rabbits 11:00, Poultry 11:00)
- Market Livestock Weights will be: Swine: 200-300 pounds, Beef: 1050-1800 pounds, Goats: 55-120 pounds, Lambs: 100-170 pounds, Rabbits: 3-6 pounds, Poultry: 3.5-9 pounds
- A Junior Livestock Sale Declaration form must be completed, signed by both the exhibitor and a parent, for all species except rabbits, and returned to the Fair Office by 5 p.m. Thursday, August 2<sup>nd</sup>.  
Meat Pen Rabbit Declarations are due by 9 a.m. Friday, August 3<sup>rd</sup>.
